Wesley, John (no date) A Narrative of the Late Work of God at or near Northampton in New England, extracted from Mr Edward's letter to Dr Coleman by John Wesley MA. (Bristol). Printed by Felix Farley. Signed by George Hudson on the back flyleaf. Is this the "Railway King George Hudson," 1800-1871?

Although bound in leather, the book is in poor condition, the spine having been attached with ugly tape. The front cover has suffered serious damage, perhaps by a candle flame, and the leather is missing a 120mm strip on the front cover. LOT No. 2

Kershaw James, The Methodist, a poem attempted in Plain metre, printed by G. Burbage, Nottingham, 1780. Disbound. Boards with leather spine. Crude signature "Smalley" on front flyleaf. 134 pp. 150mm x 190mm x 12mm. About this LOT No.: 'The Methodist attempted in Plain Metre,' a sort of Wesleyan epic, published at Nottingham in 1780, but not approved by Wesley, who feared it might deter the elect from perusing more edifying works, and determined henceforth to exercise a censorship over Methodist publications. Written by **KERSHAW, JAMES** (1730? –1797), Methodist preacher, a native of Halifax, was born about 1730. He joined a Socinian club in Halifax, whose members deputed him and another, in 1761, to attend a sermon to be delivered by Henry Venn [q. v.] at Huddersfield, in order 'to furnish matter of merriment for the next meeting,' But Kershaw left the church after the sermon exclaiming, ' Surely God is in this place; there is no matter for laughter here,' He subsequently called on the preacher, was converted, and became one of Venn's constant correspondents (*Life and letters of Henry Venn*, 1836, passim). Kershaw soon afterwards became known as an itinerant Methodist preacher and accompanied John Wesley on more than one occasion in his rapid journeys about the north of England. He settled down at Gainsborough about 1770 and was famous in the neighbourhood for his quack medicines. He continued to preach, but only at irregular intervals, and occupied his leisure in writing. He died at Ashby-de-la-Zouch in 1797. Copies on the internet at £950 (Abebooks).

[and:] [drop-head title:] A Metaphysical Essay, [c. 1730], pp. 4. [and:] [drop-head title:] A Divine Poem, [c.1730], pp. 4, contemporary tree sheep, rebaked a little crudely. An early collection of Whitefield sermons (he was in his early 20s). Whitefield has recently been characterised (Thomas S. Kidd, *George Whitefield: America's Spiritual Founding Father* (Yale University Press, 2014) as 'the most influential Anglo-American evangelical leader of the eighteenth century, the first internationally famous itinerant preacher and the first modern transatlantic celebrity of any kind, [and] the greatest evangelical preacher that the world has ever seen. The Christian's Companion was apparently issued serially (not part by part), each third gathering having an additional signature, indicating its number in the series. The 3 Sedgwick titles cut very close, with loss of catchwords, are all of signal rarity. (ESTC T57934: ESTC N64895; Foxon S186: ESTC T117092; Foxon S184: ESTC T194949; Foxon S181). incorrigible Dissenter",[5] or as "a treacherous, unfriendly man".[6] A more accurate appraisal of Bennet is given by Nehemiah Curnock, when he stated that Bennet was "one of the most successful of the north-country evangelists".[7] As James Everett remarked: "few men were more useful in the early stages of Methodism than he."
