Primitive Methodists were keen to tell people about Jesus and often stood up in town centres to do so. Police constables would often arrest them and some of them went to prison, which was unfair.



Many Prims felt called by God to work with prisoners both within prisons and in the courts.

We all make mistakes and life can get very messy, but Jesus is waiting for us to call on him to help.

Jesus took all people's messiness onto the cross. It was on the cross that the mess was straightened out.

- Use a cork coaster or cut out a circle or square from thick cardboard to make a base.
- Press pins into the base to make a shape of a cross.
- Wind coloured thread around the pins to make the cross. It doesn't matter if it is very messy, like the one in the picture!
